Comrade Bosil Lamere 77 – Answers Final Roll Call

Veteran of Civil War Succumbs to Paralytic Stroke – Member Co. B, 96<sup>th</sup> Regt. NY Volunteers

From the effects of a stroke of paralysis. Bosil Lamere died early Saturday morning at the home of his son, Fred Lamere, Front Street, in the 77<sup>th</sup> year of his age. His wife predeceased him a year ago.

Mr. Lamere served with distinction in the Civil War as a member of Companies B and G, 96<sup>th</sup> Regt., NY Volunteer Infantry. He was wounded at the Battle of Chancellorsville.

He leaves a sister, Mrs. A. Bresset, of Douglass, and two brothers, Joseph of Ticonderoga, and Herbert of Michigan. There are five surviving sons, namely Elick, Pete, Willie, Fred, and Herbert all of Keeseville.

A requiem mass for the repose of his soul was celebrated Monday morning in St. John the Baptist Roman Catholic Church by the rector. Interment was made in the church cemetery. The bearers were Frank Perkett, Mose Bombard, Eli Willard and Eli Benway.
