#### WILLIAM TRUDO

An intelligent and most industrious farmer and lumber manufacturer of Altona, near West Plattsburgh, son of Bartholemew and Eliza Louise (Burbige) Trudo, was born in the town of Plattsburgh, Clinton County, November 17, 1855. Bartholemew Trudo was descended from French ancestors; and his wife, who was born in Lincolnshire, England, was of Irish extraction. They were the parents of twenty-one children, of whom nine grew to maturity, and eight are still living. The father died December 22, 1876 at sixty years of age, and the mother December 2, 1895, aged seventy-three years. Their remains are resting in the Catholic cemetery at Plattsburgh.

William Trudo was educated in the public schools of Plattsburgh; and in 1873, at about eighteen years of age, he settled on the farm where he now resides. It contains about four hundred acres of comparatively new land, and he is profitably engaged in general farming and lumbering, conducting the sawmill that was erected by his father in 1873. He has put in a large amount of hard work on his farm, but prefers this active life to an easier one with less returns. On November 23, 1875, he was married to Miss Eliza Gardner, of Altona, a daughter of Peter and Dorcas (Come) Gardner. SKETCH OF THE LATE JOHN B. TRUDEAU PASSED AWAY AT HIS HOME IN ALTONA ON MONDAY

John Burbige Trudeau, one of the best known men 'in this county, died at his home in he village of Altona at 11 o'clock Monday evening December 10, 1917. He had been in ill health for the past six weeks and his death was caused by a cancer of the intestines. His sufferings were severe during the last few weeks of his life, but he was conscious and cheerful till the last.

Mr: Trudeau was born on July 22, 1843 in the United States Barracks at Plattsburgh. At the time of his birth his father, whose name was Bartholomew, was engaged in building the Barracks.
